The Family. I/we will:

- Ensure that my child/children will arrive at school on time (8.45am).
- Ensure that my child/children attends regularly, and that a letter covers all absences.
- Not take holidays during term time.
- Attend Parent Evenings to discuss child's/children's progress, twice yearly.
- Give due importance to homework ensuring it is completed and returned on time, and actively work with my child/children whenever possible.
- Read regularly with my child/children.
- Encourage my child to take increasing responsibility as they progress through the school.
- Not use social media for inappropriate comments about staff or pupils at the school
- Inform the school of any concerns or problems at home or school that may affect my child's/children's work or behaviour.
- Keep the school informed of any changes in circumstances (i.e. address, phone number, emergency contacts etc.)
- Ensure that my child/children arrive at school wearing our agreed school uniform and is properly equipped for the day.
- Support the school's aims, policies and guidelines.
- Support the school's policy for behaviour and discipline.
- Use the car park with care and consideration to others, keeping speed to a minimum and parking only in designated spaces.

- Show respect for others.
