Healthy School Initiative

As part of the healthy school initiative, we continue to encourage the children to be active at playtimes and improve their fitness by completing the 'Daily Mile'. This is done from a walking pace to a jogging/running pace as each child increases in speed and ability.

Children will be encouraged to drink water throughout the day; therefore it is important that the children have their bottles in everyday! It makes it easier for the children if the bottles have a sports top, as it would prevent any unnecessary spillage.

Information**

Information

This term the children will come to school wearing their PE days: Mondays/ Tuesdays

PE Uniform: white plain t-shirt, royal blue shorts and black trainers (seasonal)

PE Cold weather -navy plain tracksuit tops (no hoods), jogging pants and black trainers will be needed.

P.E will be outdoors if the weather allows. ***Please ensure all clothing is clearly labelled.***

Speaking and Listening

Talk with your child about things you are doing together. Explain new words and phrases and give your child words to use if s/he is struggling with an explanation. Always encourage your child to ask questions and listen to the answers.

Reading

We have invested heavily in our scheme, for 'Early Reading and Phonics'. The scheme is called 'Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised' and is on the Government accredited list for teaching phonics. You can visit their website for more information and look at the parent section, which will show videos of how the children will be taught to pronounce the different letters and sounds.

The children will bring home one or two decodable books, which they can read more fluently and will have practised in school the previous week. Any other book taken home will be a book to share with you reading to or with your child. Please ensure that the decodable book is returned to school on time as other children will be relying on using the book, the following week. (A cost will be incurred for any books that are lost or damaged).

Supporting your child with reading

Although your child will be taught to read at school, you can have a huge impact on their reading journey by continuing their practice at home. There are two types of reading book that your child may bring home:

A reading practice book (Decodable phonic book)

This will be at the correct phonic stage for your child. They should be able to read this fluently and independently.

A sharing book (library book)

Your child will not be able to read this on their own. This book is for you both to read and enjoy together.

Reading practice book

This book has been carefully matched to your child's current reading level. If your child is reading it with little help, please don't worry that it's too easy - your child needs to develop fluency and confidence in reading. Listen to them read the book. Remember to give them lots of praise - celebrate their success! If they can't read a word, encourage them to have a go and then read it to them. After they have finished, talk about the book together. Please continue to complete reading record books each night, to communicate how your child has read or enjoyed a book with you.

Sharing book

In order to encourage your child to develop their vocabulary and become a lifelong reader, it is important that they learn to read for pleasure. The sharing book is a book they have chosen for you to enjoy together.

Please remember that you shouldn't expect your child to read this alone. Read it to or with them. Discuss the pictures, enjoy the story, predict what might happen next, use different voices for the characters, explore the facts in a non-fiction book. The main thing is that you have fun!

RE -Autumn term topics

Prophecy and Promise

Children will learn about the prophet Isaiah.

We will find out about John the Baptist.

The Annunciation of Mary.

The Birth of Jesus.

Children will know and understand the importance of: Preparing for special times,

Advent the four weeks of preparation for the celebration of Jesus at Christmas.

We will also find out about Judaism as part of our learning from other religions.

English

Spelling

Pupils will learn to spell by:

- Segmenting spoken words into phonemes and representing these by graphemes, spelling many correctly.
- Learning new ways of spelling phonemes for which one or more spellings are already known, and learn some words with each spelling, including a few common homophones.
- Learning to spell common exception words.
- Learning to spell more words with contracted forms.
- Learning the possessive apostrophe (singular) [for example, the girl's book]
- Distinguishing between homophones and near-homophones

Composition

Pupils will learn to develop positive attitudes towards stamina for writing by:

- Writing narratives about personal experiences and those of others (real and fiction).
- Writing about real events.
- Writing poetry.
- Writing for different purposes.

Vocabulary, Grammar & Punctuation

Pupils should be able to develop their understanding of the following concepts:

- Learning how to use both familiar and new punctuation correctly, including full stops, capital letters, exclamation marks, question marks, commas for lists and apostrophes for contracted forms and the possessive (singular).
- Sentences with different forms: statement, question, exclamation, command.
- Expanded noun phrases to describe and specify [for example, the blue butterfly].
- The present and past tenses correctly and consistently including the progressive form.
- Subordination (using when, if, that, or because) and co-ordination (using or, and, or but).

Science - Seasonal Changes and micro habitats

Children will learn:

- To observe and describe weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies.
- To observe changes across the four seasons
- To understand the seasonal changes in day length
- To observe the seasonal habits of animals

Micro habitats:

Identify and name a variety of plants and animals.

Recall that minibeasts live in microhabitats.

Describe microhabitats and their conditions.

Describe how microhabitats provide for the basic needs of animals and plants.

Describe the job role of a botanist

Mathematics

Addition & Subtraction

- Solve problems with addition and subtraction: using concrete objects and pictorial representations; applying their increasing knowledge of mental and written methods.
- Recall and use add and subtract facts to 20 fluently and derive and use related facts up to 100.
- Add and subtract numbers using concrete objects, pictorial representations, and mentally, including: a 2-digit no and 1s or 10s; two 2-digit numbers; adding three 1-digit numbers.
- Show that addition of two numbers can be done in any order (commutative) and subtraction of one number from another cannot.
- Recognise and use the inverse relationship between addition and subtraction and use this to check calculations and missing number problems.

Geometry - properties of shapes

- Name and describe 2D and 3D shapes by their properties including number of vertices, faces and edges.
- Compare and sort common 2D and 3D shapes.
- Order and arrange combinations of mathematical objects in patterns and sequences.
- Find the vertical lines of symmetry of simple shapes.
- Describe the position, direction and movement and in terms of right angles.

Geography -

Would you rather live in a hot or cold climate?

Children will:

- ✚ Name and locate the seven continents on a world map.
- ✚ Locate the North and the South Poles on a world map.
- ✚ Locate the Equator on a world map.
- ✚ Describe some similarities and differences between the UK and Kenya.
- ✚ Investigate the weather, writing about it using key vocabulary and explaining whether they live in a hot or cold place.
- ✚ Recognise the features of hot and cold places.
- ✚ Locate some countries with hot or cold climates on a world map.

Music

Playing in an orchestra - playing together.

What does music teach us about the past?

Children will be:

- Listening to a rhythm and responding
- Learning to sing a song.
- Following a singing leader, knowing when to start and stop.
- Play the glockenspiel and percussion instruments with a song.
- Compose with a song
- Create a graphic score.

We will also be learning songs for our Christmas performance.

PSHE - Relationships

- To learn the skills surrounding managing secrets; resisting pressure and getting help as well as recognising hurtful behaviour.
- To recognise the things, we have in common and differences; playing and work cooperatively; sharing opinions

RSE - Journey in Love (Social & Emotional)

- To recognise the joy and friendship of belonging to a diverse community.

PE - Social and Dance

This half term the children will be working on their co-ordination:

- Learning static and dynamic balances.
- To work in partnership and explore, circles, shape and artistry in relation to dance.
- Trying several times if at first they don't succeed.
- To help, praise and encourage others in their learning.

Monday and Tuesday are our P.E days.

Please send your child in royal blue PE shorts and plain white t-shirt, under navy outdoor PE jogging pants and a sweatshirt, along with a waterproof warm coat.

Children will

- Explore different types of map.
- Draw a map of their journey to school, including key landmarks and different types of mark-making.
- Follow instructions to make a piece of felt that holds together and resembles their map.
- Decide how to place 'jigsaw' pieces to create an abstract composition.
- Make choices about which details from their map to include in a stained glass.
- Design a print with simple lines and shapes, making improvements as they work.
- Make and print from a polystyrene tile.
- Choose a favourite artwork, justifying their choice and annotating it to explain their choice
