General class Information

Big Maths

Every Monday morning, the children will be

taught in small groups led by an adult.

The teaching will focus on the key objectives in Maths for that week at the pupil's appropriate stage and level of learning.

This small group work will help to address any mistakes or misconceptions the children may have with number and close any gaps in their knowledge.

The aim is to increase a pupil's confidence, accelerate progress and secure fluency in basic skills.

To best help your child in Maths, please support with homework tasks and practice fluency in times tables and number bonds.

Reading

The children will develop their reading in class throughout the week through shared reading and guided reading sessions. I shall be monitoring their reading progress carefully each week with my own records. Our class reading book for this half term is 'A Girl called Joy' by Jenny Valentine. Your child will bring home two books; a reading banded book and a Sharing Book to read and share with you.

Reading Banded Book

The reading banded book should be at a level the child can read at comfortably and not struggle, with some fluency and understanding. The band will be directed by the Class Teacher.

The reading records are for parents to record your child's reading at home. We ask all our children to read for 20 minutes each night. Although I will be keeping my own record of your child's reading progress it would be really helpful if you could make comments in your child's reading record book each time they read, to let me know how they have coped with a book at home. Home reading records are checked regularly.

Home reading records are checked three times a week and a reading target will be given each week. If your child keeps their own record of their reading, we kindly request that a parent/guardian signs this record, at least once a week to acknowledge their child's reading. If your child reads any other reading material as well as their reading book from school, please also make a note of it in their reading record. The home reading record is also a good way to make contact with me if you wish to send me a message.

Sharing/Library book

In order to encourage your child to develop their vocabulary and become a lifelong reader, it is important that they learn to read for pleasure. The sharing book is a book they have chosen for you to enjoy together. Please remember that you shouldn't expect your child to read this alone. Read it with them. Discuss pictures, enjoy the story, predict what might happen next, use different voices for the characters, explore the facts in a non-fiction book. The main thing is that you have fun!

The school continues to run an early-doors reading and number club 8am -8:45am each morning. We ask that children are in the club by 8.20am. Please pay using the Parent Pay app.

The children will be taught to:

- Work together to develop ideas and rules in rounders.
- Modify the game and rules to create smaller group games.

Please ensure that your child wears the correct PE uniform of navy jogging pants, navy sweatshirt (without a hood please), white t-shirt, royal blue shorts and black trainers.

Prophecy and Promise - Branch 2

Pupils will learn about David, focusing on two critical events in his life.

They will:

- Understand that David was a great king chosen in the Old testament.
- Know some psalms and learn how the O Antiphons are used by Christians to reflect on the significance of Jesus coming at Christmas.

Judaism:

English

Reading

The children will be encouraged to maintain positive attitudes to reading and have an understanding of what they have read. We will be continuing to read and discuss an increasingly wide range of fiction, poetry, non-fiction and reference books or textbooks.

Writing and Grammar

Using Pathways to Write - Beowulf by Michael Morpurgo, the children will be taught the skills of:

- Identifying the audience and writing for purpose and layout.
- Make notes on ideas, drawing on reading and research where necessary.
- In narrative, describe settings, characters and atmosphere.
- Proof-read for spelling and punctuation errors.
- Use appropriate vocabulary.
- Demonstrate the use of grammar in their writing.

Spelling

Children will be given spelling lists to learn. They will be taught to spell these at school, find their meanings using a dictionary and discover other words with similar spelling patterns. Children can be practicing their spellings at home and encouraged to spell these throughout each week.

Science

Properties and Changes of Materials

The children will explore the properties of everyday materials and determine:

- Their hardness and link to their uses.
- The transparency and link to their uses.
- The thermal and electrical conductivity of materials.
- Reversible and irreversible changes.

Mathematics

Number and Place Value

- Read and write numbers up to 1,000,000.
- Use $\lt \gt$ = to compare numbers.
- Understand place value in numbers with 3 decimal places.

Addition and Subtraction

- Mental addition and subtraction including money.
- Add using column addition and decomposition for subtraction.
- Finding the difference between two amounts using a number line.

Multiplication and Division

- Learn times tables up to 12×12 .
- Use knowledge of times tables facts to help find common multiples.
- Find factor of two-digit numbers.
- Divide mentally, deciding whether to round up or down depending on the context.
- Use the grid method to multiply 2, 3 and 4-digit numbers.

Measures / Shape and Position

- Investigate perimeter area and angles.

Music

Charanga:

The children will learn songs and use skills:

- To move to the pulse with ease.
- To think about the message of songs.
- To compare two songs in the same style, talking about what stands out musically in each of them, similarities and differences.

They will:

- Listen carefully and respectfully to other people's thoughts about the music.
- Talk about the musical dimensions working together in the Unit songs.
- Talk about the music and how it makes you feel.

Geography

What is lifelike in the Alps?

The children will learn what life is like in the Alps. They will be able to:

- Locate the Alps on a world map.
- Locate physical and human features of the Alps.
- Use data to map a route through the Alps.
- Compare the geography of their area with the Alps and describe what life is like in the Alps.

PSHE

The children will learn about different family structures which will provide opportunities to:

- Promote diversity and tolerance towards difference.
- To make children think about different ways of being brought up and address discrimination against children with 'unusual' family compositions.
- Anti-bullying week
- Being a good friend, dealing with conflict

- To show knowledge and understanding of emotional relationship changes as we grow and develop.

Art and Design

Drawing - I need Space

This unit focuses on retrofuturism and developing artistic drawing skills by:

- Exploring the purpose and effect of imagery.
- Exploring decision making in creativity.
- Developing drawn ideas through printmaking.
- Testing and revisiting ideas using sketch books.

Computing

Mars Rover 1

The children will identify some of the types of data that the Mars Rover collects and:

- Identify how and why data is collected from space.
- Read and calculate number using binary code.
- Identify the computer architecture of the Mars Rover
- Use simple operations to calculate bit patterns.
- Represent binary as text.
